HISTORY



Mount Falacro
has watched over Drama since the late

5th millennium BC.
Nested at its foot, Drama flourished thanks to abundant water and a fertile plain. Originally settled by Thracians, this charming spot became a bustling hub of trade with the Greek colonies along the Thracian and Macedonian coasts.

By the mid-4th century BC, Philip II of Macedon couldn't resist the allure of Drama and brought it into his vast kingdom.

The Romans soon took over, making Drama a satellite of Philippi, and the Byzantine era brought transformation as the town grew from a modest fortification to a key commercial hub known as "Darma." It had a colorful history, passing briefly into the hands of Latin Crusaders, then the Serbs, and eventually the Ottomans.



In the 18th century, Drama struck gold—the green gold of tobacco, to be precise. The tobacco boom brought wealth, the proof of which still stands today in the grand old mansions and warehouses dotting the city. During the Macedonian Struggle, Archbishop Chrysostomos led Drama's resistance against Bulgarian pressure, safeguarding Greek education and culture.

Drama's role during the Macedonian Struggle was no less dramatic, led by Archbishop Chrysostomos, who fiercely defended Greek culture against Bulgarian influence. The city wasn't so lucky in the 20th century, enduring Bulgarian occupations during both World Wars—suffering brutal attacks in 1941 and losing much of its Jewish population.

HISTORY

But Drama's spirit persevered! Nestled at the foot of Mount Falakro, surrounded by springs and lush greenery, Drama today is a place of cultural pride. Every year, it celebrates its liberation with the vibrant "Eleftheria" festival, and cinephiles from around the world gather for its International Short Film Festival.

The Cave is located just 23 kilometers northwest of Drama and is the only river cave in Greece that has been developed for exploration. A highlight of the visit is the "Hall of the Wheel," named after the impressive 8-meter-wide hydraulic wheel found inside.




DAY TRIPS


